


Qualification Route to Becoming an Animal Keeper

Job Positions in the Zoo Sector - Upper Management

The following job roles are an outline of some of the key positions within a zoo, highlighting the main responsibilities of the role as well as the experience and qualification commonly needed.

It is important to remember that individual zoos will have slightly different requirements and they may have different titles, such as trainee keeper maybe referred to as junior animal keeper.

Zoological Director

Responsibilities: Ensuring the smooth running of the animal department, whilst maintaining high levels of welfare and developing the zoo.

Experience: Operational and people management skills, extensive leadership and management experience in an accredited zoological organisation. **Qualifications:** BSc in a field related to the position and management qualifications. A MSc or higher is preferred.

Curator

Responsibilities: Oversee the animal sections and staff management to ensure high levels of welfare and conservation. To support in the development of the zoo and the Zoological Director in decision making.

Experience: 15+ years in a zoological setting with leadership experience and in-depth knowledge of zoological data systems, breeding programmes and the husbandry needs of a variety of species.

Qualifications: BSc in an animal related field and management qualifications.

Assistant Curator

Responsibilities: To support the curator in decision making and ensuring high levels of welfare and visitor experiences. To work with the heads of section to ensure good animal husbandry care and staff management.

Experience: Minimum of 15 years in a zoological setting and leadership experience. Knowledge of husbandry needs of a variety of species.

Qualifications: HND in an animal related field and DMZAA. Supervision training and a qualification in management is an advantage.

Job Positions in the Zoo Sector

Head of Section

Responsibilities: The day to day management of the animal section and staff, ensure high levels of welfare and ensuring a positive visitor experience.

Experience: 10 years in a zoological setting with 5 years of leadership experience. Good IT literacy, knowledge of zoological organisations.

Qualifications: DMZAA or Level 3 Animal related

qualification. BSc an advantage.

Deputy Head of Section

Responsibilities: Support the day to day running of the animal section and manage the section in the absence of the Head of Section.

Experience: At least 8 years in a zoological setting, as well as leadership experience. Good IT literacy and knowledge of zoological organisations

Qualifications: DMZAA or Level 3 Animal related qualification. BSc an advantage.

Senior Animal Keeper

Responsibilities: Maintain the husbandry requirements and welfare of the animals. Provide a positive visitor experience. Support staff training and manage staff to support the daily running of the animal section.

Experience: Minimum of 5 years in a zoological setting and some experience of supervising staff.

Qualifications: DMZAA or Level 3 Animal related qualification

Qualified Animal Keeper

Responsibilities: Maintain the husbandry requirements and welfare of the animals. Provide a positive visitor experience and support staff training.

Experience: 2-3 years in a zoological setting.

Qualifications: DMZAA or Level 3

Animal related qualification.

DMZAA – Diploma in the Management of Zoo and Aquarium Animals

Trainee Animal Keeper

Responsibilities: Maintain the husbandry requirements and welfare of the animals. Provide a positive visitor experience.

Experience: Previous work experience within a zoo or similar establishment would be an advantage.

Qualifications: On the job training through the DMZAA qualification or apprenticeship in zoo and aquarium management.

These are broad job requirements and only a selection of the possible roles.

Qualifications: Level 3 in Animal Management **Experience:** Minimum of

Aquarist

Qualifications: BSc Biology, Marine Biology or Zoology Aquaculture **Experience:** Minimum of

two years

Tips: Aquarist jobs are technical and gaining experience in plumbing and water chemistry is useful.

Field Ranger

Qualifications: Diploma in nature conservation Experience: People, leadership and DIY skills Can lead to: Reserve

Manager

Tips: There are a number of field ranger opportunities in the UK, including volunteer positions.

Student Keeper

Qualifications: Level 3 in Animal Management Experience: Work experience with animals Can lead to: Animal

keeper

Tips: These are unpaid positions, so make sure you can fund yourself.

Presenter

Qualifications: GCSE in Maths, English and

Science

Experience: Public

speaking

Can lead to: Roles in education or events. **Tips:** Developing good

personal and

communication skills are

key.

Conservation Scientist

Qualifications: BSc, MSc

and/or PhD

Experience: Research methods, field work **Can lead to:** Lead

scientist

Tips: Your area of study will determine which area you work in. The role can be office based or field based or a mixture of both.

Animal Nutritionist

Qualifications: BSc Nutrition or Animal

Science

Experience: Practical farm experience

Can lead to: Specialist

field consultant

Tips: Can do a HND in human nutrition followed by a BSc in Animal Science

Visitor Volunteer

Qualifications: None

required

Experience: Interacting with people in a public

setting

Can lead to: Animal work experience
Tips: This form of volunteering is a good way to discover more about how zoos operate and build confidence.

Keeper Volunteer

Qualifications:

Completing a Level 1, 2 or 3 in animal care

Experience: Any animal

experience

Can lead to: Student

keeper

Tips: A good way to gain experience alongside gaining qualifications.

Education Officer

Qualifications: BSc in Animal Science or Education

Experience: Minimum of two years working with children and groups

Can lead to: Learning

Manager

Tips: Working with scout groups, or youth groups is a good way to gain experience.
